Clairvoyance: seeing what is not normally seen, divining, prophecy, visions, future, past lives

Cognitive: concerned with acquisition of knowledge, reasoning, mental, intellectual, cerebral rational

Contemplation: it is a state of being totally aware of the present moment, having something as a possible intention, considering something, thinking about spiritual matters, looking up something thoughtfully

Conventional: socially excepted, usual or established, of gathering of people, based on consent

Cosmic: our whole universe as perceived by human beings, of universe apart from earth, enormous

Criteria: standard for judging things, conditions, norms, measures, principles, reasons

Destiny: somebody's preordained future, inner realisable purpose of life, something that predetermines events

E

Effortless: done with no effort, unforced, easy, unproblematic, graceful, natural, uncomplicated, painless

Ego: self-esteem, inflated opinion of self, part of my and containing consciousness, self

Egoless: without an ego

Electromagnetism: magnetism from electric currents, interaction of electromagnetic forces

Emanating: to come from, to send out

Empowerment: give authority to somebody, make more confident or assertive, enabling

Enablement: provide somebody with means

Enabling: confirming legal power, allowing, empowering, aiding, assisting, supporting, facilitating

Enlightenment: achievement of spiritual state **Entelechy:** for existence, life giving force

Epistemology: the branch of philosophy concerned with the theory of knowledge. Epistemology studies the nature of knowledge, the rationality of belief, and justification. Much of the debate in epistemology centers on four areas: (1) the philosophical analysis of the nature of knowledge and how it relates to such concepts as

truth, belief, and justification, (2) various problems of skepticism, (3) the sources and scope of knowledge and justified belief, and (4) the criteria for knowledge and justification.

Ethology: study of animal behavioural patterns

Meditation has the strongest effect sizes in terms of its impact on negative emotions, state and trait anxiety, neuroticism, self-realization, and learning and memory

Meridian: line of acupuncture points

Mindfulness: aware. Is when there is attention but non-attachment to the field of experience. Mindfulness may have a strong effect on self-concept and in the reduction of features of personality. Defined as paying attention nonjudgmentally in the present moment and on purpose

Mystical: with divine meaning, with supernatural significance, mysterious, numinous, magical, spiritual, transcendent

Mysticism: belief in intuitive spiritual revelation, spiritual system

Neuroticism: a higher-order personality trait in the study of psychology characterized by anxiety, fear, moodiness, worry, envy, frustration, jealousy, and loneliness

Newtonian: of classical mechanics, which is concerned with the set of physical laws describing the motion of

Numinous: mysteriously associated with deity, Holy

Objective: free of bias, based on facts, observable, existing independently of mind

Paranormal: impossible to explain scientifically, mystical, supernatural, psychic, miraculous

Parapsychological: of unexplained mental phenomena

Placebo: prescription without physical effect, with an inactive substance

Postcognition: ability to see an event after it has occurred, re-enactment of an event

Precognition: ability to foresee events

Premise: basis of argument, principal, foundation, evidence

Pretence: insincere or feigned behaviour, unwarranted claim, make-believe, same as pretension

Proprioception: the unconscious perception of movement and spatial orientation arising from stimuli within the

body itself

Psychodynamics: interaction of emotional forces, inner forces affecting behaviour

Psychometry: ability to "read" information from objects

Purposefulness: determined, having a goal, commitment, tenacity, devotion, dedication, drive, persistence,

perseverance

Pyrokinesis: ability to ignite or extinguish fires with the mind

Quantum physics: is a fundamental branch of physics concerned with processes involving, for example, atoms and photons. In such processes, said to be quantized, the action has been observed to be only in integer multiples of the

Planck constant, a physical quantity that is exceedingly, indeed perhaps ultimately, small. This is utterly

inexplicable in classical physics

interact with a spirit world and channel these transcendental energies into this world

Somatic: affecting body as distinct from mind, relating to outer walls of body **Subjective:** not impartial, existing by perception, observed only by patient

Telekinesis: also known as Psychokinesis, power to move things without touching them Telepathy: extrasensory psychic communication, thought transference, mind reading Transcendence: go beyond limits, surpass something, be independent of the world Transpersonal: used by different schools of philosophy and psychology to describe experiences and worldviews
